

IntegriSport Project kicks off – GLMS partners with key stakeholders in order to support capacity building of law enforcement authorities (LEAs) across Europe

Lausanne, 8 February 2019, GLMS joined on 30-31 January 2019 a series of strong partners in the official kick-off of the IntegriSport project. The project, which is co-funded by the EU ERASMUS+ programme, will seek to raise awareness among law enforcement authorities across Europe on risks related to sport competition manipulations. With criminal organisations infiltrating sports, strong education and capacity building activities for law enforcement agencies are crucial for the global fight against the phenomenon.

The project that comprises two phases – the research phase and the awareness-raising phase – is run by CSCF – Foundation for Sport Integrity and beyond GLMS, its partners include 7 Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) across Europe. The project will also have the support of the Council of Europe – which was present at the kick-off meeting – and will be complementary to the Keep Crime out of Sport (KCOOS+) of the Council of Europe, in which GLMS is also a key partner.
